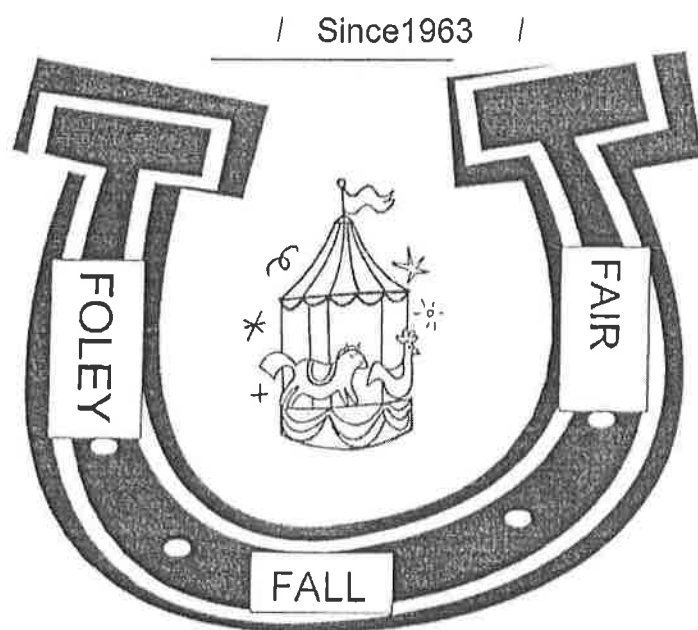

OUR MISSION STATEMENT

"To encourage an awareness of agriculture by holding an annual agricultural fair as well as through other activitiesTo promote and enrich the quality of life of people in our community"

RULES & REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS:

1. An exhibit fee of \$5.00 entitles the holder to membership in the Society for the current year and to receive an admission ticket to the Fair. The Society will retain \$5.00 from all exhibitors who win \$5.00 or more, as a membership for the following year.
2. You may pick up tags at the Thrift Shop at the Coop any Saturday between 8 and noon or at a Seguin library. Alternatively, you may contact Janet at iborneman@vianet.ca or by telephone at 705-378-1438 to make arrangements to pick up tags.
3. All exhibits must be brought to the Foley Community Centre **Thursday, August 29, 2019 between 9 a.m.- 9 p.m.** All exhibits must remain in the Hall until Sunday, and can be picked up between 10 a.m. - 2:00 pm. The Hall will be secured at all times, when unattended. Please note that if you have more than a couple of exhibits, you must be at the Hall no later than 8:30 p.m. in order to have time to process your exhibits.
4. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor to entitle them to receive a prize and must be made within the last 12 months. Articles soiled or worn are **NOT** eligible for competition.
5. No article will be permitted unless names, initials or distinguishing marks are **covered.**
6. All articles are to be handmade and must be free of all odors, including smoke, moth balls and mould. Any article with any odor will be disqualified before competition and will not be judged. No plants, flowers or vegetables with bugs will be accepted. A Board Member on behalf of the Society reserves the right to accept or reject ANY entry.
7. No persons will be admitted to the Hall during Judging except the Officers duly appointed to attend.
8. Any exhibitor removing any of their exhibits from the Hall prior to closing on Sunday will forfeit the right to prize money. Exhibits can be picked up Sunday, September 1, 2019 between 10 am and 2 pm.
9. No person shall in any way interfere with the judges or the judging.
10. If any article is entered in any class to which it does not belong, the judges

are not to award it a prize, no matter what its merits may be.

11. While the Board will take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of the exhibits, by entering their exhibit, the exhibit owner agrees to release and hold harmless the Foley Agricultural Society, its Directors, Officers, employees, volunteers and all others associated with the Fair and its activities in the event any exhibit is damaged, lost or stolen.
12. All judging will take place on the Friday of the Fair, in the Hall. Judge's decision is final. If only one (1) exhibit appears in a section, that exhibit does not necessarily win a prize. Prizes will be awarded on merit.
13. All exhibitors are requested to send a list of prizes and an estimate of money won, to the Janet Borneman within seven (7) days following the Fair.
14. All prize money may be picked up at the Awards Pot Luck on Saturday, September 14, 2019 at 6:00 pm. Monies not picked up on Awards Night will be mailed in the form of a cheque, payable to the exhibitor. **Children's monies are in the form of cash and will not be mailed. Please make arrangements for pick up at another time or designate someone to pick up in your place.** Please tender all cheques on or before October 31st of the current year.
15. Claims of clerical errors must be made and received no later than five (7) days after the Fair.
16. Protests, if any, shall be made in writing to the Board and received within 48 hours of the closing of the Fair in order to be considered.
17. No selling of exhibits will be permitted.
18. Each Agricultural Society is entitled to enter a quilt in the District Competition for the "Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies". The special rules and regulations are posted on our website:
www.foleyagriculturalsociety.ca .
19. Only ONE (1) entry per person will be allowed under each SECTION in a Class.
20. Unless otherwise indicated, one piece will mean a unit (i.e. one dish towel); a pair (i.e. a pair of mittens) or a set (i.e. baby booties, hat and sweater).

21. Entries in Sewing, Knitting and Crochet classes must attach a sample of the fabric/fibre/wool to the entry tag.

22. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to complete the entry form.

Unless otherwise stated, the prize money for children's competitions is as follows:

1st - \$2.00, 2nd - \$1.50, 3rd - \$1.00, 4th - \$0.75, 5th - \$0.50, 6th - \$0.25, 7th - \$0.25. 8th - \$0.25

JUNIOR PRIZE LIST 2017-2020

PRIMARY Age 5 years and Under

ART & WRITING - max. size-approx. 23 x 30 cm- Attach tag to bottom right hand corner

1. Make a construction paper sunflower decorated with sunflower seeds.
2. Sponge Painting
3. Colour enclosed Colouring Page
4. Fruit or vegetable stamping picture
5. A picture made from cereal

CRAFTS - no kits-attach tag to bottom right hand corner

6. Make a caterpillar using an egg carton
7. Decorate a Straw Hat
8. Make a bug that might be found in your garden using any medium.
9. Make a flower from coffee filters (decorate & include stem)
10. Make a necklace from edible material
11. Decorate a pine cone to look like a Christmas tree

SCIENCE – Attach Tag to containers or to bottom right hand corner

12. Flowers - 3 blooms grown from seed
13. Grow a vegetable plant in a plastic/paper cup (bean, pea)
14. Figure-made with vegetables.

BAKING - must be on disposable plate etc., and plastic covered-attach tag to plate. As only decorations are being judged, items may be store bought.

15. Large cookie-max 12 cm-decorated-decorations only to be judged
16. Decorate 2 cupcakes (judged on decorations only)
17. Gingerbread man-max 20cm- decorations only to be judged

JUNIOR Ages 6 and 7 years

ART & WRITING - max. size-approx. 23 x 30 cm- attach tag to bottom right hand corner

18. Colour the enclosed Colouring Page
19. Make a book mark with a Garden Theme (max. 2" x6")
20. Make a birthday card
21. Make a butterfly by drawing, colouring, painting or a combination.

SEWING & NEEDLEWORK - attach tag to article on bottom right hand corner

22. Decorate a ball cap
23. Picture made from scraps (wool, fabric, felt, etc.)
24. Any hand sewn article

CRAFTS - no kits-attach tag to bottom right hand corner

25. Decorate a flower pot
26. Make a garden stepping stone
27. Make a homemade musical instrument
28. Make a wind chime from any recycled material
29. Make a bird feeder from a 2 litre pop bottle
30. Decorate a hair band.

SCIENCE – Attach Tag to containers or to bottom right hand corner

31. Flowers -3 blooms grown from seed
32. Vegetables -3 vegetables grown from seed
33. Figure-made from vegetables
34. Grow a sponge salad. (instructions available on website) (attach tag to plate)

BAKING - must be on disposable plate etc., and plastic covered-attach tag to plate

41. Create a stuffed toy by sewing, knitting or crocheting

CRAFTS - no kits-attach tag to bottom right hand corner

44. Create a car using a box no larger than a tissue box
45. Make and decorate a garden stepping stone

65. Hand made belt (any medium)
66. Sew, knit or crochet a fashion accessory

CRAFTS - no kits-attach tag to bottom right hand corner

67. Decorate a jar or bottle suitable for a vase

3. Number of cookies to be shown at local Fair/Exhibition to be determined by each individual Fair/Exhibition.
4. District/Provincial Competition Rules must be posted in the prize book of each local Fair/Exhibition. - **NEW**

District Competition

5. The winner from each Fair/Exhibition will be eligible to enter at the District Competition.
6. District entry must consist of 8 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name and address using the entry tag provided. - **UPDATED**
7. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, must be no larger than 3" (6.75 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).
8. Prize money to be paid by the District.

Provincial Competition

9. The entrant must be the winner from the District Competition.
10. In the case where the district winner is unable to send an entry to the convention, then the 2nd place District winner will be eligible to enter.
11. The entry for the District must consist of 8 cookies displayed on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, address and District represented using the entry tag provided. - **UPDATED**
12. Plain Chocolate Chip Cookies, with no nuts are to be no larger than 3" (6.75 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm).

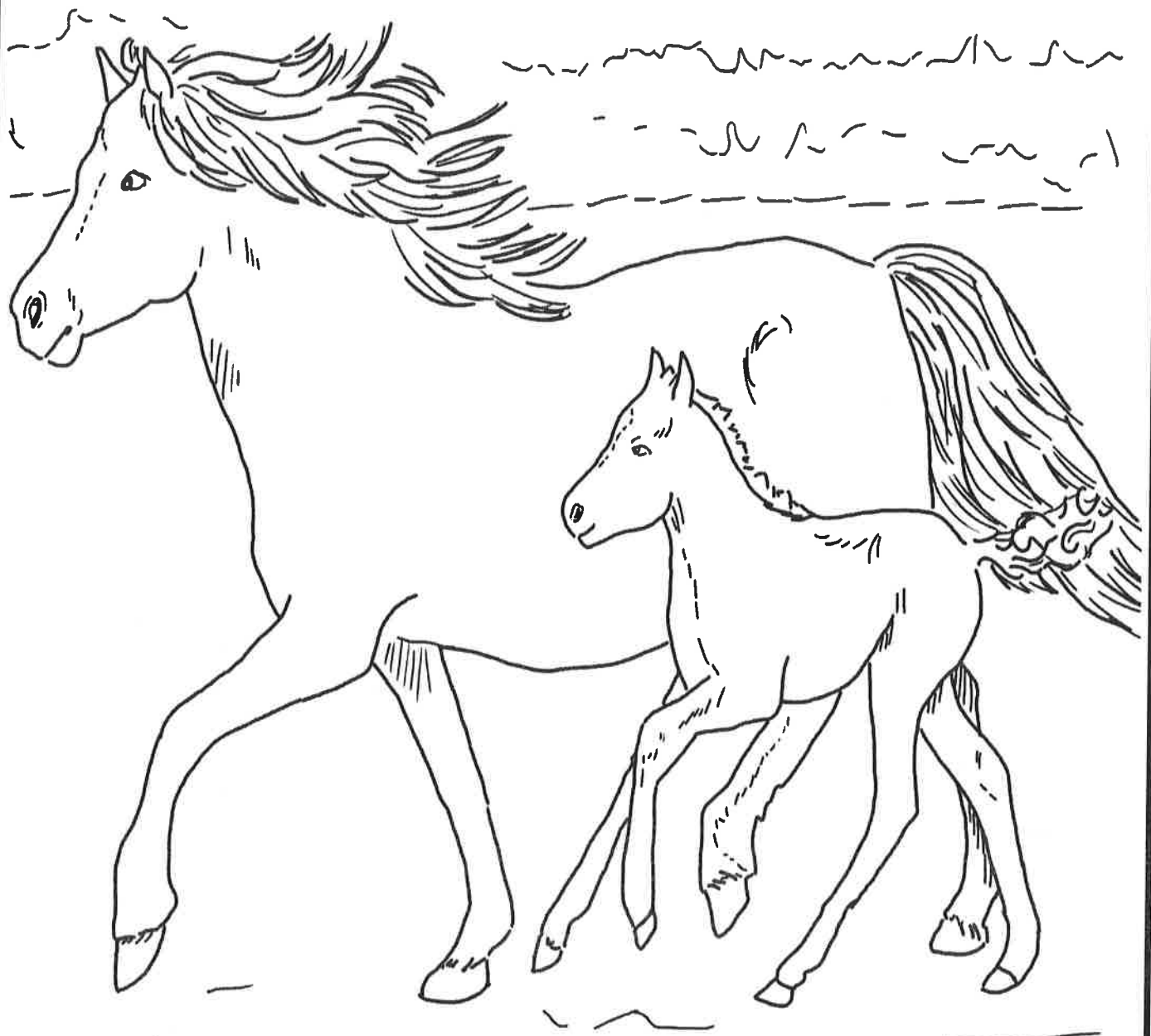
